FUTURE OF PROFESSIONAL QUALIFICATIONS IN EUROPE

Professional Qualifications Directive 2005/36/EC, adopted in 2005, sets the rules for mutual recognition of professional qualifications of those (employees or self-employed) willing to work in another Member State. Holders of diplomas certifying successful completion of training at post-secondary level of a duration of at least one year should be permitted access to a regulated profession in a Member State where access is contingent upon possession of a diploma certifying successful completion of higher or university education of four years' duration, regardless of the level to which the diploma required in the host Member State belongs. In order to modernize the Directive and simplify its rules, the European Commission will come up with a legislative proposal in December 2011 based on the results of the public consultation on a Green Paper on professional qualifications opened from June till September 2011. The revision should facilitate geographical mobility of workers and improve a functioning of the internal market. The Commission also considers a creation of a professional card.

Many questions arise: Should be the code of conduct for national administrations on practices for recognition of professional qualifications enforced into legislation? Should be the professional card introduced as a status to be recognised throughout the Union? What the key considerations should be in the updating of minimum training requirements?
